The 2012 Professional Development Conference will be conducted on Thursday, March 22. Expect the day to be high energy and engaging with our guest presenter Michele Payn-Knoper of Cause Matters Corp. MPK is known for energizing every person in her hands-on training workshops through a lot of interaction and insight about the food, feed and farming business. Whether she's challenging people to build connections with food, bringing out humor with boxing gloves

or offering a unique perspective on agricultural advocacy, Michele's sparkle, spunk and mastery will bring out the best of ideas.

Michele founded AgChat and FoodChat, weekly moderated discussions on Twitter, in April 2009. Over 10,000 people from 10 countries have used the tag associated with this highly visible conversation around food and farm issues. Topics are community driven and have included animal welfare, biotechnology, food labeling, sustainability and translating science.

She has marketed to agribusinesses around the world, raised \$5,000,000 for the FFA, worked in e-business,

and still breeds registered Holsteins. More importantly, she puts her words into action as an active volunteer in her community, church, and industry – and loves to learn from helping others. Michele Payn-Knoper's unique blend of experiences led her to found Cause Matters Corp. to create a connection between the farm gate and dinner plate. Dr. Jimmy Henning's office is able to provide generous support of our conference so that we may experience this dynamic presenter.
